Monday, April 25, 2022

Hybrid Meeting

1. Call to Order Chair Schultz called the meeting to order at 2:03 PM

Committee Members Present: Chair Schultz Michelle Roettger, Supervisor Mary Mawhinney, Kris Pehl, Jennifer Borlick, Brad Heuer, Deb Dewitt. Excused: Vice Chair Sandy Disrud.

2. Approve Agenda

Moved by Supervisor Mawhinney, seconded by Ms. Borlick **Approved**

3. Citizen Participation, Communications and Announcements

Ms. Borlick announced that she has been elected as President-Elect of the Wisconsin Land Information Association

4. Approval of Minutes

- a. September 27, 2021 Minutes

5. Review, Discussion and Possible Action

- a. Update on Wisconsin Land Information Program

- i. Strategic Initiative Grant Update

1. Remonumentation Update - County Surveyor

Mr. Heuer stated that he was in the process of completing the remonumentation of the last section corner. He will begin remonumentation of section corners that have not been surveyed since prior to 1980 and updating tie sheets to the new format. He approximates over 100 corners. This will not be finished by the end of the year, but he would like to get as many completed as possible.

2. Grant Status Update

Ms. Schultz stated that the funds for the remonumentation project come from the 2021 Strategic Initiative Grant. The County has been approved for the 2022 Grant. In that approval, she confirmed with the grant administrator that we could use 2022 Grant funding for the upcoming Parcel Fabric Implementation Project even though the 2021 Grant funds aren't fully expended. The 2022 Grant funds will be distributed in one payment of \$60,000 rather than 50% at the beginning of the year and 50% upon completion of the project.

- ii. Statewide Parcel Map Update

Data was submitted and was deemed sufficient. This year there were gaps between the County parcels and the City of Beloit parcels. The City of Beloit is working on correcting the gaps.

iii. 2021 Retained Fee/Grant Report

Ms. Schultz presented the draft report and stated that should anyone find anything missing or incorrect to let her know.

b. Ongoing Land Records Projects Updates

i. 2020 Imagery & LiDAR Project

Ms. Borlick stated that the USGS still has not confirmed the data, but that the county can distribute the data with the understanding that it is not the final product.

ii. GIS Server & Database Upgrade

Ms. Borlick stated that Server and Database upgrade is completed as far as the vendor part of the project. She will continue to update the data and maps for consistency and best practices. The new Maps, Apps and Data page is on ArcGIS Online and not the county server.

iii. Register of Deeds Bastion Upgrade

Ms. Schultz stated that the Register of Deeds Office has moved online documents to a cloud server to provide redundancy in access and an internet browser based access.

iv. Parcel Fabric Implementation

The parcel fabric implementation project was approved in the budget and the decision document has been approved by the Information Technology Department. Preliminary talks have begun with Pro-West Associates for a quote.

v. NG911 at Rock County Update

Ms. Pehl explained that she has been working on preparing the data for NG-911 implementation for a couple of years. The Wisconsin Department of Miliatry Affairs has contracted with AT&T to develop the ESINET. Rock County submitted a participation agreement on April 13. Kick-off meeting will be held with members of IT and 9-1-1 Communications. There is no indication that the software vendors will change their fields to match NG911 format, so for now, Ms. Pehl is maintaining 2 different sets of fields in the address point data.

c. Legislative Update – Jennifer Borlick

i. Governor Evers signed into law Act 673 which creates a \$1.5M dollar grant program for the implementation of Next Gen 9-1-1 grant.

ii. Street Address Assignment Bill which would require assigning addresses at the time of plat approval did not make it to the floor for a vote.

- iii. Broadband Grant Expansion Program Grant passed both houses along party lines. Evers likely to veto.
 - iv. Governor Evers signed into law Act 174 which eliminates the need to re-file easements every 40 years.
 - v. Redistricting- Wisconsin Supreme Court approved Gov. Evers maps. Went to the US Supreme Court. US Supreme Court kicked the Assembly and Senate maps back to the Wisconsin Supreme court. Wisconsin Supreme Court adopted the GOP Senate and Assembly districts. Ms. Borlick is working with the County Clerk to coordinate updates with the municipalities affected.
 - vi. We need to keep an eye on Federal "Daniel's Law" which would force municipalities to remove all online location records of certain people including address, property information and possibly imagery.
